Introduction

The goal of the IAEA School on Nuclear and Radiological Leadership for Safety (Leadership School) is to help IAEA Member States gain a better understanding of what leadership for safety means in practice. The focus is on the application of nuclear and radiological safety leadership concepts to real-life situations through the use of case studies, presentations, exercises, discussions and keynote addresses based on IAEA Safety Standards and guidelines. This is an intensive course, facilitated by senior international experts. Participants will broaden their leadership skills using progressively complex scenarios, through individual study, and in-class group work and dialogues. An interactive platform for discussion and the sharing of experiences among participants both during and after the Leadership School will further enhance skills development. This course will provide participants with skills and knowledge that will be useful throughout their careers and contribute to a culture for safety within their organizations and the capacity building efforts of their individual Member States.

Objectives

The purpose of the event is to train early to mid-career professionals in nuclear and radiological leadership for safety. The objective is to deliver a two-week programme of the IAEA School on Nuclear and Radiological Leadership for Safety, a training based on General Safety Requirements, Leadership and Management for Safety (GSR Part 2). The Leadership School will cover topics such as Leadership for Safety, Safety Culture and the Systemic Approach using realistic case studies. The case studies cover a range of nuclear and radiation safety scenarios. Participants will work in groups using an interactive dialogue approach along with facilitators acting as mentors, guiding, and challenging participants in learning on leadership for safety.

Target Audience

The Leadership School is for early-to mid-career professionals with 10 to 15 years' experience from regulatory bodies, licensed operators or users and related organizations who have demonstrated leadership potential through professional achievements.
